9 a.m. - 8 p.m. "To Shiloh" Bus Tour led by Tim Smith

Today's tour will concentrate on getting the armies to Shiloh. We will start at Corinth, seeing the Interpretive Center there as well as

the historic houses where the Confederate generals planned the Battle of Shiloh. We will also see the railroad crossing that was the cause of it all. Once we leave Corinth, we will follow the historic route of the Confederate march to Shiloh, seeing the Mickey's Farm House site where it all came together as well as the Confederate deployment area. After arriving at Shiloh, we will see Pittsburg Landing, where the Union forces came to the field.

6:30 p.m. "The Terrain Factor at Shiloh" talk by Tim Smith

This lecture will describe the terrain of Shiloh, discussing why the battlefield itself impacted how the battle was fought. This will be an introduction to the two days of fighting at Shiloh that we will begin touring in detail the next morning.

Bus Tour Description:

Today we will focus on the majority of Day 1 at Shiloh, April 6, 1862. We will cover all the famous sites in a chronological timeline of how the battle was fought. By the end of the day participants will understand the Union "trading space for time" mentality and how it was working, as well as how the terrain discussed the night before impacted the fighting.

Bus Tour Description:

Today, we will focus on the last part of Day 1, Grant's Last Line of Defense, and delve into the fighting on Day 2, April 7, 1862. We will follow the fighting across the battlefield as the Union forces counterattack and win the battle. On the way back to Corinth we will also see Fallen Timbers, site of the April 8, 1862 follow -up action.

 - Grant's Headquarters during the night
- Confederate Day 2 line of battle
- Union flanking areas

8 a.m. to 6 p.m. "Corinth Siege and Battle" Bus Tour led by Tim Smith

Bus Tour Description:

On this day we will follow up the Shiloh action with the important Siege of Corinth, where the Federals took the city and the railroad crossing in May 1862, as well as the Battle of Corinth, when the Confederates tried to retake the city in October 1862. We will finish the tour by following the Confederate retreat from Corinth in October out to the battlefield at Davis Bridge.

Timothy B. Smith (Ph.D. Mississippi State University, 2001) is a veteran of the National Park Service and currently teaches history at the University of Tennessee at Martin. In addition to numerous articles and essays, he is the author, editor, or co-editor of more than twenty books with several university and commercial presses. His books have won numerous book awards, his trilogy on the American Civil War's Tennessee River campaign (Forts Henry and Donelson, Shiloh, and Corinth) winning a total of nine book awards. He has recently finished a five-volume study of the Vicksburg Campaign for the University Press of Kansas and a new

study of Albert Sidney Johnston for LSU Press. He lives with his wife Kelly and daughters Mary Kate and Leah Grace in Adamsville, Tennessee.

The Atlanta Campaign (May–September 1864) was a significant military operation during the Civil War, led by Union General William Tecumseh Sherman. The campaign aimed to seize the vital Confederate city of Atlanta, Georgia, a crucial transportation and industrial hub for the South. Sherman's forces engaged in a series of battles against Confederate General Joseph E. Johnston, and later General John Bell Hood, who took command after Johnston's retreat. Through relentless flanking maneuvers, Sherman's army gradually pushed the Confederates back towards Atlanta, capturing the city in early September. The fall of Atlanta was a critical blow to the Confederacy, boosting Northern morale and helping secure President Abraham Lincoln's re-election. Sherman's success also set the stage for his infamous "March to the Sea."

Our tour of this campaign will be led by Gary Ecelbarger visiting Snake Creek Gap, Resaca Battlefield Historical site, Kolb's Farm, Kennesaw Mountain, Chattahoochee river defenses, site of General Johnston's firing, Battle of Atlanta sites, Ezra Church sites, Kilpatrick Raid, Battle of Jonesboro, Atlanta History Center (including the Cyclorama) and so much more!
